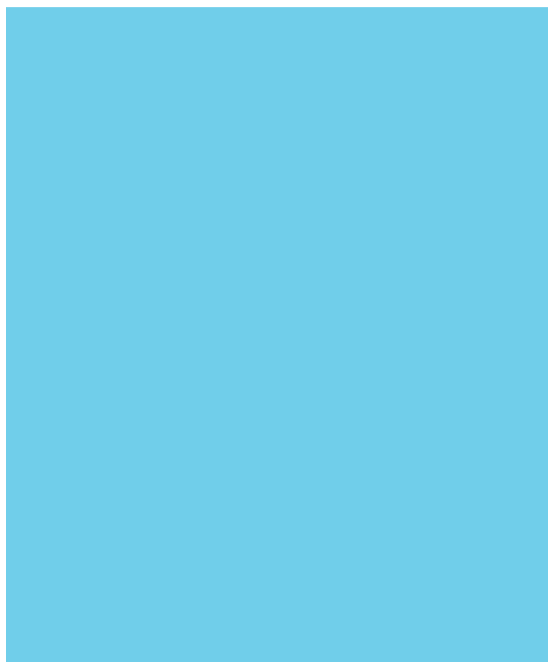

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Cancer Patient Support Services (CaPSS)

You're not alone on your journey. We're here to help.

Support

Cancer Patient Support Services (CaPSS) helps cancer patients and their families cope more effectively with the emotional and physical changes resulting from a cancer diagnosis. This innovative program is the first and only one of its kind in Pinellas County. CaPSS offers targeted support groups for patients and caregivers and is committed to treating the whole person - body, mind and spirit. Each group is led by qualified, licensed (or license-eligible) counselors. Spanish-speaking cancer counseling and support groups are also available. CaPSS also offers individual and family counseling to Morton Plant Mease cancer patients, their families and significant others that focuses on coping with and adjusting to living with cancer. All services are free of charge.

- All Cancer Support Group: For men and women who are coping with cancer
- Caregiver Support Group: For friends, family and loved ones who are providing caregiving and support to a patient
- Luna de Pinellas: A support group in Spanish for cancer patients, survivors, their immediate family and close friends
- Prostate Cancer Discussion Group: For males patients only
- Women's Cancer Support Group: For women of any age and any type of cancer

Education

The Community Cancer Education sessions feature cancer-related information provided by physicians and other health care professionals. All cancer patients, family members and friends in the community are welcome to attend.

Knowledge is power. The *Breast Cancer Patient Handbook* was designed to provide information on what patients need to know when they are first diagnosed. The handbook includes educational information about breast cancer, websites and community resources.

Cancer-related books and material are available to patients, families and the community at no charge in the Evelyn R. Simmers Oncology Resource Libraries located at Morton Plant Hospital in the Axelrod Pavilion on the 1st floor, and at Mease Countryside Hospital in the Shaffer Tower on the 4th floor. CaPSS offices are located on the 2nd floor of the Axelrod Pavilion at Morton Plant Hospital and the 4th floor at Mease Countryside Hospital.

Patient Navigation for Breast

After a patient is diagnosed with breast cancer at Morton Plant Hospital, the CaPSS breast cancer navigator, Agnes Jastrzebski, RN, CBHN, Breast Care Nurse Navigator, provides individualized guidance. She follows patients throughout every aspect of treatment and coordinates their care, including any necessary tests, treatment and follow-up care prescribed by the patient's team of specialists. Exercise for Cancer Patients/Survivors

POWER: Program of Wellness Recovery

Mind/Body Connection

Mindfulness Meditation Class

Mindfulness Meditation is a mind/body connection program for Morton Plant Mease cancer patients and family members. It's all about moment-to-moment awareness. Through Mindfulness Meditation, you can learn how to take better care of yourself and live a healthier life. It's a technique to help people cope with stress, anxiety, pain and illness. Guided Imagery

Guided imagery has been shown to help increase one's hope and motivation, decrease depression and fatigue and reduce the perception of pain. CaPSS counselors are available to provide guided imagery to Morton Plant Mease cancer patients and families who are interested in learning this technique. Qi-Gong

This is a training program to introduce Morton Plant Mease cancer patients to the practice of qi gong (pronounced CHEE GOONG). Qi gong is an exercise that originated in China and has been practiced for thousands of years. Breast Cancer – Genetic Testing/Counseling

Who is at risk for breast cancer?

All women are at risk for breast cancer. While men also get the disease, it’s approximately 100 times more common in women than in men. A woman’s risk of breast cancer also increases as she gets older. Women with a family history of breast or ovarian cancer are also at a higher risk of developing the disease. The more blood relatives you have with breast or ovarian cancer, the stronger your family history and the greater your risk. Sometimes a very strong family history is caused by a genetic mutation. While the majority of breast cancers are not caused by inherited risk, research has shown that approximately 7 percent of breast cancer cases are hereditary.

- Talk to your family members to learn your family health history.
- Talk to your doctor about your personal risk for breast cancer.
- Ask your doctor which screening tests are right for you, if you are at a higher risk.

How is this risk inherited?

We’re all born with two copies of about 30,000 different genes, one copy of each gene from our mother and one copy from our father. Two genes in particular, BRCA1 and BRCA2, normally work to prevent breast cancer. But in some cases, we can inherit a BRCA1 or BRCA2 alteration from either parent. This alteration or mutation interferes with the normal activity of the gene, making us more susceptible to breast cancer.

How do I know if I have inherited an altered gene?

To find out if you have inherited an altered BRCA1 or BRCA2 gene, you can undergo BRACAnalysis®. By analyzing a sample of your blood or saliva, scientists can determine any mutations in the BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes. A mutated gene indicates a genetic predisposition to hereditary breast cancer. It’s important to note that the presence of a BRCA1 or BRCA2 gene mutation is NOT a breast cancer diagnosis nor does it mean that a breast cancer diagnosis is inevitable.

If I have an altered gene, what are my options?

Identifying your inherited risk can help you and your doctor make the most informed decisions about your future health care. For example, a woman who knows she carries a BRCA mutation may start breast cancer screening at an earlier age. She may also choose to take risk-reducing medications or have preventive surgery.

Genetic Testing Facilities and Costs

Testing for abnormal BRCA1, BRCA2 and PALB2 genes is usually done on a blood sample taken in your doctor's office and sent to a commercial laboratory or a research testing facility. Several laboratories perform commercial BRCA1, BRCA2 and PALB2 testing, including Myriad Genetics, Ambry Genetics and Quest Diagnostics. They report results within two to four weeks. Abnormalities in other genes have also been associated with breast cancer risk. The cost of testing ranges from approximately \$300 to \$5,000, depending on whether you are being tested for only a specific area(s) of a gene known to be abnormal or if hundreds of areas are examined within multiple genes.
