

## Improving Health Outcomes in Our Communities

A mid-cycle progress report on BayCare's Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) initiatives for 2023-2025

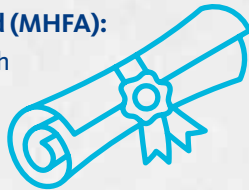
In 2022, BayCare, in partnership with the All4HealthFL Collaborative, conducted its second CHNA for West Central Florida. After reviewing community survey data and hearing from residents about their areas of greatest need, BayCare and its partners developed three collective priority areas to increase the chances of improving health outcomes in the region. The top three focus areas for 2023–2025 are behavioral health, access to health and social services, and exercise, nutrition and weight.

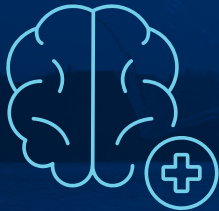

## Behavioral Health



**Metropolitan Ministries Miracles for Pasco:** Served **100** families in the shelter with **67** completing positive move-outs

**One Community Now – Valor Program:** **75%** of participants reported improved behavioral health symptoms



## Access to Health and Social Services



**Promotoras de Salud – Farmworkers Self-Help:** Completed **6,099** patient visits and distributed Narcan to **1,446** individuals

**Good Samaritan Health Clinic:** **1,222** emergency department visits avoided



## Exercise, Nutrition and Weight



**BayCare and Feeding Tampa Bay Feeding Minds School-Based Food Pantries:** **9** pantries distributed **678,126** pounds of food

**Premier Community HealthCare Healthy Living Coach Program:** **43** diabetic graduates with **41** active diabetic enrollees
