Community Health Needs Assessment: 2020 Focus Areas

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) requires nonprofit hospitals to conduct an assessment of the health needs of the people in the communities they serve and take steps toward addressing those needs.

BayCare and other area organizations including Florida Department of Health, Advent Health, Tampa General Hospital, Lakeland Regional Hospital, Suncoast Community Health Centers, Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital, Moffitt Cancer Center, and Shriner's Hospital for Children, conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) in the spring of 2019 throughout Hillsborough, Pasco, Pinellas, and Polk counties.

The CHNA is a systematic, data-driven approach used to determine the health status, behaviors, and needs of residents. It provides information from quantitative and qualitative sources so that communities may identify issues of greatest concern, explore opportunities to collaborate with community partners, and commit resources to priority areas.

The survey results, along with additional health statistics data, and key informant interviews, revealed 11 key health issues. Healthy Communities Institute was hired to compile and interpret the data and in July leaders from the involved organizations along with community members gathered in focus groups to discuss these areas. Following the discussions, prioritization exercises were conducted based on the magnitude of the health issue and the perceived likelihood for positive impact of each issue. This exercise resulted in the top three focus areas of Behavioral Health, Access to Healthcare, and Exercise/Nutrition/Weight.

Across the BayCare Health System, Faith Community Nursing is strategically poised to have a positive, healthy impact on our communities in each of these areas. Primarily, the faith community nurse is an access point for healthcare, so continuing to grow partnerships across our counties remains a high priority. Daily, FCNs meet people where they are, assisting them with their healthcare needs. Each hospital FCN program has submitted proposals for addressing needs in at least one of these areas. As we begin this three-year focus on the identified top needs, be on the lookout for new strategies from your FCN leaders. We look forward to all that FCN will do to impact the health of our communities.

CHNA Initiatives: 2020-2022

Please join us in prayer for these new 3-year FCN initiatives to have a meaningful impact in our communities:

- We will offer at least 16 community-based **Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)** training events, with one FCN Coordinator trained as a MHFA Instructor.
- We will embed a part-time, bilingual (Spanish/English) FCN Coordinator in a Pasco County community previously unreached by our programming.
- Another Coordinator will provide wellness-promotion services (8 hrs/week)
 at The Shepherd Center in Tarpon Springs. Several surrounding churches
 already support the center with donations of time, food, resources and/or
 referrals. We hope to engage them in developing a health ministry function
 that will serve individual congregations and also provide a collaborative,
 ongoing health ministry presence for clients of The Shepherd Center.

The Shepherd Center is a Tarpon Springs nonprofit that provides goods and services to the homeless and needy. A food pantry, feeding program and thrift store operate in the current building on Pinellas St.

Opening Soon: The Hope Center building will feature a serving kitchen, laundry room, office and dining space, an outdoor patio and restrooms with showers. There will be space for individual health coaching and small classes.

BayCare's commitment to our community continues to grow along with our community health grants. With the renewal of GIFT and DEEP, our programs have expanded into all four counties (Pinellas, Pasco, Hillsborough, and Polk).

Get Into Fitness Today (GIFT) is our 12 week weight loss and wellness program geared to help participants with nutrition, physical activity and weight loss goals. **Diabetes Empowerment Education Program (DEEP)** is our 6 week diabetes management program geared for participants with diabetes, pre-diabetes and/or caretakers. Both programs are completely free to the community and do not require physician referrals.

In the New Year, we are looking for new locations to host our programs. We are hoping with your combined efforts, we are able to find more locations. We need a minimum of 5 participants to run the program. Maximum of 15 for DEEP and 20 for GIFT. Participants must be 18 years or older.

Faith Community Nursing partnered with local service organization, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.- Zeta Upsilon Omega Chapter in celebration for their MLK Day of Service honoring the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Their service project goal was to create a clothing closet for Campbell Park Elementary School (CPES) by installing hanging racks, shelving and baskets and stock the closet

with shoes, jackets, belts, uniform tops and bottoms, underwear, and socks. St. Anthony's FCN coordinator, **Ruby Hope, RN**, **BSN** (pictured bottom left), volunteered and the FCN department provided hygiene items: disposal wash clothes, toothbrushes and toothpaste to stock the closet.

Wearing soiled or ill-fitting clothing can make a child feel self-conscious and isolated....wondering can my classmates see my wet clothes? What do I do if I don't have a change of clothes in my backpack? What if I barely have clothes? CPES students live in one of the poorest areas of Pinellas County and has one of the highest number of homeless students. St. Anthony's FCN Department wanted to be a part of this MLK Day of Service project by helping to ensure that CPES students have the self-confidence they need to focus on their learning experience to succeed in the classroom, which is critical to their growth and development. Students who use the closet can continue their learning experience free of shame, embarrassment or self-consciousness knowing that they are wearing clean clothing that complies with the school's dress code.

This service project promotes Dr. MLK Jr's Legacy by supporting his belief in education. One of Dr. King's famous quotes is "The function of education is to teach one to think intensively and to think critically. Intelligence plus character – that is the goal of true education." St. Anthony's mission in action will help these students concentrate on learning.
