








Primary Care Sports Medicine Fellowship















History

The USF-MPM Primary Care Sports Medicine Fellowship was founded in 2009 as a partnership between two of Florida's leading health care institutions: the University of South Florida Morsani College of Medicine and Morton Plant Mease, part of BayCare Health System. The fellowship accepts two fellows per year. Graduates have gone on to private practice and to academic centers in the practice of family, internal and primary care sports medicine.

Facilities

The primary teaching hospital is Morton Plant Hospital in Clearwater, Florida. This 687-bed facility has served the Clearwater community for nearly a century. It's accredited by The Joint Commission as a Primary Stroke Care Center, houses the Morgan Heart Hospital and is the recipient of the Society of Thoracic Surgeons three-star rating.

The clinics at USF use EPIC EMR and BayCare uses Cerner. Our Family Medicine Residency and Sports Medicine Fellowship programs are located in the Turley Family Health Center. The center has 36 exam rooms, on-site laboratory and imaging services, seven procedure rooms, spirometry, audiology and sports ultrasound. The center also has a full-time billing and referral office, a licensed clinical social worker, weight management clinic, triage service and prescription departments. In addition, there's a pharmacy residency program. Fellows will have their continuity clinic and two of their primary care sports medicine clinics at this site.

USF Health Morsani College of Medicine is fully accredited by the Liaison Committee for Medical Education. The medical school was established by the Florida Legislature in 1965, and has become a major academic medical center, known statewide and nationally for its innovative curriculum.

Faculty

The core faculty in the fellowship includes five board-certified family physicians who have their CAQ and were fellowship trained in primary care sports medicine. In addition to the core faculty, the fellows will have the opportunity to train with several of the area's finest specialists with areas of specialization in radiology, cardiology, spine, hand, foot and ankle, sports medicine, pediatrics and joint replacement. These specialists are available at both Morton Plant Hospital and the USF Health Campus, and are integrated into the curriculum.

Curriculum

The curriculum is focused on several core rotations as well as elective and research rotations. These are updated on our website for review. The longitudinal curriculum involves ongoing competency training in sports ultrasound, neurocognitive assessment and treatment of concussion as well as, ECG interpretation in athletes. Fellows will also participate in various types of scholarly activity ranging from research, QI and articles for publication. Community education and resident teaching is also included and encouraged.

There's extensive event coverage involving USF athletics, including training room time. At USF, fellows are actively involved in the care of soccer, basketball and football teams. The fellows also have the opportunity to be involved with high school football coverage during the fall. There's an ongoing volunteer relationship with the Rothman Institute to assist in the care of the Philadelphia Phillies during baseball's spring training, as well as season-long coverage of their single-A team, the Clearwater Threshers. We're also the sports medicine providers for the Toronto Blue Jays' U.S. operations, which includes Major League Baseball spring training coverage and ongoing coverage of their minor league operations.

Spring training coverage also includes the MLS Philadelphia Union. We're now the primary care sports medicine providers for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Mass event coverage includes the Ironman Florida 70.3, the *Tampa Bay Times* Turkey Trot, and St. Anthony's Olympic Distance Triathlon. See the FAQs section on our website for more information.

Benefits

The package includes a competitive salary plus multiple benefits. Each year, residents receive an educational allowance and educational leave, paid vacation and paid holidays. The program also reimburses the registration fee for the CAQ examination and the annual AMSSM Research Conference. Additionally, there's a relocation allowance and an iPhone is provided for use.

Resident Teaching

Medical students and senior residents frequently rotate in the sports medicine clinics, and fellows will have some supervisory roles with case presentations to the attendings. Our program is a teaching site for medical students performing third-year primary care clerkships and fourth-year acting internships from the University of South Florida and a core family medicine rotation for fourth-year Florida State University medical students.
